



ITINERARY **A** **B** **C** **D** **E** **F**

Approximate distance: **1,3 km**

Description: This route climbs to the top of the castle of Sant Joan, by taking the first left-hand turning off the path leading to the Cala de Sant Francesc. The access is by a newly-asphalted path. It should be borne in mind that this route climbs 175 metres, so the need for a vehicle should be considered.

Some points of interest along the route:

11. Belvedere

This is a small level area which you find just before reaching the top of the hill, and it has a magnificent view over the cliffs of Sant Joan, the harbour and the bay.

12. Chapel of Sant Joan

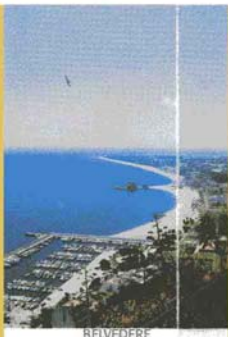
This chapel was first documented during the 15th century and is dedicated to St. John the Baptist.

13. Castle of Sant Joan

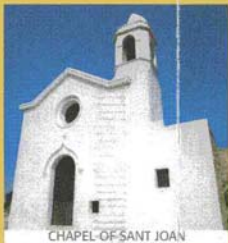
The first records of this castle date back to the 11th C., although its period of greatest activity was from the 13th to 15th centuries. Recently, a team of architects has restored all of the surrounding area. This lookout point gives a view of practically all of the municipal area and many of the neighbouring villages. (*)

Other possibilities:

- If on foot, you can descend by a track on the northern slope which comes out below Santa Bàrbara, connecting with Itinerary D.
- You can also take the old path leading uphill from the neighbourhood of Sa Carbonera, which combines asphalted and non-asphalted sections and steps.
